INITIAL EACH PARAGRAPH AFTER READING)
1. MY RIGHT TO A TRIAL BY JURY. I understand that I have the right to have my guilt or innocence decided by twelve (12) persons of the community sitting as a jury who must arrive at a unanimous verdict of guilty or not guilty, and if I give up my right to trial by jury, I have the right to be tried by a judge sitting without a jury.
2. MY RIGHT TO A SPEEDY TRIAL. I understand that I have a right to enter a plea of guilty or nolo contendere or to be brought to trial within thirty (30) days from the date of my arraignment if I am in custody, or forty-five (45) days from the date of my arraignment if I am not in custody. If I am not brought to trial or enter a plea within the statutory period of time, I have a right to have my case dismissed, unless I personally waive the statutory period of time, I have a right to have my case dismissed, unless I personally waive the statutory time limit.
3. MY RIGHT TO CONFRONTATION OF WITNESSES. I understand that I have the right to be confronted by the witnesses against me, that is to see and hear them testify against me in open court, and to cross-examine witnesses that testify against me, that is ask questions of them, and to use the process of the court to subpoena witnesses on my behalf without cost to me.
4. MY RIGHT AGAINST SELF-INCRIMINATION. I understand that pursuant to the Constitution of the United States and of the State of California, that I do not have to be a witness against myself. I further understand that if a plea of guilty or nolo contendere is entered on my behalf that such a plea is an admission against me and will incriminate me.
5. MY RIGHT TO BE SENTENCED WITHIN REASONABLE TIME. I understand that I cannot be sentenced any earlier than six (6) hours or any longer than five (5) days after a plea has been entered or I am found guilty unless I specifically waive the statutory time for sentencing.
6. MY RIGHT TO BE INFORMED OF THE CHARGES AND OF THE CONSEQUENCES OF A PLEA. Generally most misdemeanors have a penalty of 6 months and/or a \$1,000 fine. If the penalty for your offense is any different or if there are direct legal consequences beyond the fine and/or imprisonment, the Court will advise you. Each fine carries with it a penalty assessment which will be added to the fine assessed. The penalty assessment is a statutory fee mandated by the State Legislature. The judge will read the charges to you at arraignment.
7. MY RIGHT TO BE REPRESENTED BY A LAWYER. I understand that I have the right to be represented by a lawyer throughout the proceedings. I understand that the Court will appoint a free lawyer for me if I cannot afford to hire a lawyer, but at the end of the case I may be asked to pay all or part of the cost of that lawyer, if I can afford to. I understand that there are dangers and disadvantages to giving up my right to a lawyer and that it is almost always unwise to represent myself.
8. I HAVE ALSO BEEN ADVISED: That if I am not a citizen of the United States, a plea of guilty or a conviction in this case might subject me to deportation, exclusion from admission to the United States, or a denial of naturalization under the laws of the U.S.
9. PLEA OF NOLO CONTENDERE. I understand that a plea of nolo contendere has the same effect as a plea of guilty but cannot be used against me in a civil action arising out of this incident.
10. MY RIGHT TO BAIL. I understand that I have the right to be released on posting reasonable bail. I further understand that if I am released on my own recognizance (O.R.) I must sign an agreement promising to appear in court whenever ordered. Willful failure to appear is an additional misdemeanor for which I would be punished.
